EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Annual Report 2023 presented the highlights of accomplishments of the Provincial Local Government Unit of Davao Occidental

The report has been divided into five (5) sectors: Institutional Sector, Social Sector, Economic Sector. Environment Sector and Infrastructure Sector

With the commitment of the present administration in gearing onwards developing rural initiatives with versatility and efficiency, the Provincial Government has accomplished in 2023 in the five (5) development sectors which emphasized significant results to the constituents especially belonging to the most vulnerable sectors.

This annual accomplishment report served as a basis of the decisionmaking body in determining and finding solutions to problems, issues and concerns with the provision of interventions and technical assistance packages that will benefit the people of Davao Occidental.

1. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND



Occidental Davao was created by virtue of Republic Act 10360 enacted by the 15th Congress of the Republic of the Philippines on July 23, 2012 and signed into law by President Benigno C. Aquino III on January 14, 2013. The five

municipalities of Sta. Maria, Malita, Don Marcelino, Jose Abad Santos and Sarangani were carved out from the province of Davao del Sur to compose the province of Davao Occidental. Congressmen Franklin P. Bautista and Marc Douglas Cagas of the House of the representatives and Senator Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos were the principal authors of the law creating the province which was ratified on October 28, 2013.

In 1846, a distinguished Attorney-at-Law, Don Jose Uyanguren, upon the order of Gov. Narciso Claveria, organized settlements south of the Encomienda de Bislig. As the settlement continued to grow down South, Don Jose was able to crush Datu Bago, a Bagobo chieftain who ruled Samal Island. Don Jose's conquest expanded to the vast lush region surrounding the body of water of what is now known as the Davao Gulf. The vast settlement was called then as Caraga Province. In February 27, 1849, Gov. Claveria decreed the partition of Caraga Province in two. The northern portion was named Surigao Province, southern part of Eastern Mindanao, including Davao Gulf, was named Nueva Guipozcoa in honour of Gov. Claveria's birthplace in Spain. Nueva Guipozcoa was later on renamed Davao.

In 1898, Davao became a district of the Moro Province created by the Americans as part of Mindanao with General Leonard Wood as its first Military Governor; and in 1916, Jones Law converted Moro Province into the Department of Mindanao and Sulu. All the districts that comprise the Department became regular provinces. Don Gulalio Causing became the first Provincial Governor of Davao.

In 1956, Congressman Ismael Veloso of Davao passed a bill in dividing Davao into three provinces - - Davao Oriental, Davao del Norte and Davao del Sur. The bill was approved in the Lower House but failed to get the approval of the Senate. Congressman Lorenzo Sarmiento revived the bill in 1965. With the


support of Senator Alejandro Almendras, the bill finally got approved as Republic Act 4867 in 1967. These provinces simultaneously celebrate July 1, 1967 as their foundation day, the effective date of the appointment of their respective provincial government officials by then President Ferdinand E. Marcos.

The recent national and local elections of 2016 resulted in the election of the first set of officials of the province. The Hon. Claude P. Bautista became the first Governor of the new province of Davao Occidental together with his brother Hon. Franklin P. Bautista who was elected as first Vice-Governor and the Presiding Officer of the first Sangguniang Panlalawigan. As a new local government, Davao Occidental officially assumed its corporate existence on June 30, 2016. The newly-elected officials assumed office on July 1, 2016. The foundation anniversary of Davao Occidental is celebrated every October 28 of the year.

2. PROVINCIAL PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS

2.1 Geographical Location

Davao Occidental lies on 5°21.84' and 6°38.107' North latitude; 125°42.77' and 125°18.51' East Longitude. It is the 81st province in the Philippines located in Davao Region, one of the most progressive and competitive regions Mindanao. Specifically, it is situated in Southern Mindanao where it is bounded on the north by Davao del Sur; on the west by Sarangani Province; on the east, it is bounded by Davao Gulf; and finally, on the south, it also shares a water border with the Indonesian province of North Sulawesi. The main land mass of the province is occupied by the four (4) municipalities while the



islands of Sarangani are separated by the Sarangani Strait.

Davao Occidental can be reached by land transportation vehicles plying the Malita – Davao City routes.

Meanwhile, the Sarangani and Balut Islands can be reached by land by taking the General Santos City route. From there, scheduled ferry boats take passengers and cargoes to and from the islands. It can also be reached via barangay Balangonan of Jose Abad Santos, where small boats and Ro-ro vessels are available.

2.2 Land Area

Davao Occidental has a total land area of 264,544 hectares (Table 1). It consists of the five (5) municipalities of Sta. Maria, Malita, Don Marcelino, Jose Abad Santos and Sarangani, with Malita as its proposed seat of the Provincial Government. It has a total number of 105 barangays with Malita having the most number of barangays with 30. The province has a lone Congressional District as provided under Republic Act 10360.

The Municipality of Malita has the largest land area, making up for 45.40%, followed respectively by Jose Abad Santos with 27.37%, Don Marcelino with 15.36%, Sta. Maria with 8.50 % and the smallest, Sarangani, and making up for 3.37% of the total land area of the province.

3. <u>DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS</u>

Based on the 2020 Census of Population, the registered total population of the Province of Davao Occidental has reached 317, 159 composed of Don Marcelino – 45, 540; Jose Abad Santos (JAS) – 73, 381; Malita – 118, 197; Sta. Maria - 57,526; and Sarangani - 22,515.

The total household population of the Province recorded 316,907 with Don Marcelino – 45, 531; Jose Abad Santos (JAS) – 73, 345; Malita – 118, 001; Sta. Maria - 57, 516; and Sarangani - 22,514



PROVINCIAL DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AND MANAGEMENT OFFICE (PDRRMO)

VISION: A stronghold for all DRRM offices and the greatest catalyst that would bring forth disaster awareness towards building a disaster resilient community with climate change adaptation as a backbone for its development.

MISSION:

- a. Formulate and implement a comprehensive Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan to include the annual budget for the Programs/Projects/Activities pertinent to the four (4) thematic areas, (1) disaster prevention and mitigation; (2) disaster preparedness; (3) disaster response; and (4) disaster rehabilitation and recovery.
- b. Outline, provide and coordinate with DRRM activities consistent with the national disaster council's standards and guidelines.
- c. Organize and conduct trainings, workshops, orientation and knowledge management activities on DRRM and facilitate contingency planning activities at the provincial, municipal and barangay level.
- d. Strengthen partnership with the private sectors, civil society organizations and volunteer groups.
- e. Conduct consistent monitoring on disaster related events and mobilize all instrumentalities to utilize their facilities and resources to protect and preserve life and properties.
- Establish linkage with national and local government units for DRRM disaster response

MANDATE:

- 1. Emergency and Rescue Responses Emergency and rescue responses include medical incident, vehicular accident, trauma, crime and fire incident, drowning and retrieval and other related emergency services through augmentation of logistical resources and teams.
- 2. Standby Medic or Ambulance Standby medical personnel or ambulance services are provided during planned events in the Province of Davao Occidental to ensure preparedness and prompt response to any unforeseen incidents or emergencies.

- Trainings/Orientations on DRR and Climate Change Adaptation Provision of trainings/orientations on Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation which includes Basic Life Support, First Aid Training, Water Search and Rescue, Earthquake Orientation and Drills, DRRM Orientation, CBDRRM Trainina and other related activities requesting agencies/stakeholders.
- 4. Provision of Information, Education and Communication (IEC) Materials and other DRRM information for research purposes This service offers the provision of Information, Education and Communication (IEC) materials for widest dissemination as well as data that may be used for DRRM-CCA related research.
- 5. Issuance of Advisory and Forecast for Natural Hazards Issuance of information, advisories, and/or forecasts on hydrometeorological hazards, earthquakes, landslides, and other natural hazards through social media (i.e., Facebook) or to clients sourced from DOST-PAGASA, DOST-PHIVOLCS, DENR-MGB, the Office of Civil Defense, and MDRRMOs for the widest dissemination.
- 6. Review of Municipal DRRM Plan and Recommendation for Certification As per the mandate outlined in National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) Memo 147, s. 2017, Municipal DRRM Plans (MDRRMPs) undergo review by the Provincial Review Team. This process ensures that the plans adhere to the prescribed format and align with their Annual Investment Plans (AIPs). Subsequently, the recommended MDRRMPs will be forwarded to the OCD XI Regional Review Team for the issuance of Certification.
- 7. Processing the request for Hazard and Risk Assessment This service facilitates the processing of requests for rapid ocular inspection and assessment of recently reported geohazard incidents.
